Food FARMACry at El Pasoans Fighting Hunger

We're dedicated to not only providing food but also making a positive impact on the overall health of our community. Our Food FARMacy program plays a crucial role in this mission.

Coordinated by Louie Salazar, the program aims to improve health outcomes and reduce health care costs for neighbors with diet-related chronic conditions. By providing nutritious food each week and offering nutrition education, we help participants better manage their health.

Currently, the Food FARMacy serves 190 people, and growing. It works with 30 health care providers to ensure individuals with special medical needs are referred to us. We also connect participants with benefits and other services, giving them additional tools to help them thrive.

"Food insecurity is particularly harmful for individuals managing chronic diseases," Louie explains. "Many face tough choices between buying food and paying for medication or medical bills."

A national study by Feeding America found that 58% of households seeking food assistance have a member with high blood pressure, and 33% include someone with diabetes. Food insecurity can worsen these conditions, as limited funds often force people to buy cheaper, unhealthy food, which can often lead to more medical issues.

"Our donors' contributions are vital," Louie says. "They help us provide not just food but also the education and resources needed for long-term health improvement."
